Omaha's Henry Doorly Zoo

The Omaha Zoo is one of the biggest attractions in the mid-west, with attendance reaching 1.6 million annually. This 130-acre zoo is home to some record holding exhibits. Lee G. Simmons Conservation Park and Wildlife Safari
